Changes to sportscotland UKCC funding

UKCC Coach Education Funding

sportscotland recognises the importance of new coaches coming into sport and the need for accessible, affordable coaching courses to be available to them. 2011 sees the roll out of a new UKCC funding model to support the recruitment of new coaches and the continued development of existing coaches. Please contact the relevant Sports Development Officer to find out more information about how to access the substantial subsidies available from both sportscotland and Glasgow Life. **More information is available on the sportscotland website and the application form can be downloaded from the funding section of www.sportscotland.org.uk**

What's Different?

Candidates are now required to complete an application form and meet set criteria to access funding towards the cost of UKCC endorsed qualifications. Applicants who meet the eligibility criteria can access funding of up to £150 or 50% per person of the course fee, whichever is

lower. Group applications can be submitted when two or more individuals from the same organisation / club are applying for a course. **The cost of UKCC course are subject to change.**

Are you or your group eligible?

Applicants must demonstrate coaching activity within six months of applying for the subsidy (minimum activity supported will be once per month or an average of 12 sessions per year).

The course being attended must take place in Scotland and be registered with the SQA.

Applicants should evidence what impact this qualification will have on their school, club or community. (This should be detailed in the Applicant Support Information section of the application form.)

What else do I need to do?

1. Coaches are advised to register/become a member of their respective Sports Governing Body. Some sports require this to be done prior to being allowed on coach education courses.

2. Check with your club / school / community group that they are happy to support your application, as you must supply their contact details and this will be verified.

What happens after I apply?

Once your application is received, we will check you meet the eligibility criteria and email the decision to you within 10 working days of receipt of your application.

If I am successful

You will receive an email confirming your award. This can be used as part payment towards your course.

You will be required to forward this to your course organiser who will accept it as part payment.

If I am unsuccessful

Unfortunately you have not met the criteria on this occasion as detailed in your email response.

You can apply again for other courses or sports.

Generic Courses

Safeguarding and Protecting Children

Protect yourself, the young people you are coaching and your employer by understanding and following good coaching practice. Learn about child abuse and how to handle situations if you have concerns.

This workshop will help you to:

- identify good coaching practice to promote a positive relationship with children
- identify sport situations and coaching practice that might constitute either poor practice or possible abuse
- identify ways of dealing with your own feelings about child abuse and state what constitutes neglect, physical, sexual and emotional abuse
- recognise the signs and symptoms of abuse and appreciate why reporting it is often so difficult
- identify appropriate action if a child discloses he/she has been abused
- identify appropriate action if abuse is suspected and explain the role and responsibilities of other experts (e.g. police, social services)
- describe appropriate practice that reduces the likelihood of abuse occurring.

Safeguarding and Protecting Children 2: Reflecting On Practice

Build on knowledge gained since the first Safeguarding and Protecting Children workshop and share best practice through scenarios and reflection upon the experiences of participants.

First Aid Qualifications

Emergency First Aid at Work

On completion of training, successful candidates should be able to:

- understand the role of the first-aider, including reference to:
 - the importance of preventing cross infection
 - the need for recording incidents and actions
 - use of available equipment
- assess the situation and circumstances in order to act safely, promptly and effectively in an emergency
- administer first aid to a casualty who is unconscious (including seizure)
- administer cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- administer first aid to a casualty who is choking
- administer first aid to a casualty who is wounded or bleeding
- administer first aid to a casualty who is suffering from shock
- provide appropriate first aid to minor injuries (including small cuts, grazes and bruises, minor burns and scalds and small splinters).

Sports Injuries First Aid

This 12 hour course is for anyone wishing to gain sports injury related first aid knowledge. It is held over a weekend, divided into two 6 hour days.

Course content includes:

- introduction to first aid, incident and casualty management and record keeping
- breathing difficulties, recovery position, resuscitation, shock
- wounds and bleeding
- fractures
- head injuries

UKCC Level 1

The Level 1 certificate is a formal qualification through the SQA. It introduces coaches to the "How to" and "What to" skills of coaching as well as helping them to break down and coach the technical and tactical elements of the game. It will qualify the assistant coach to work alongside a more qualified coach, working with players in the early stages of their development.

Candidates are required to:

- be at least 16 years of age
- have some experience of playing the game
- participate in a short rally
- demonstrate knowledge and understanding of what is required when playing the game and the technicalities required when participating in a short rally.

UKCC Level 2

Upon completion of the Level 2 coaching certificate you will be qualified to coach independently and to have Level 1 coaches working with you as assistants. As a level 2 coach you will:

- be able to plan sessions suited to participant's needs and set appropriate goals
- be able to evaluate players technically and tactically
- be able to carry out the necessary health and safety checks for venues and players
- demonstrate use of a variety of communication techniques
- prepare candidates appropriately for coaching sessions
- understand your roles and responsibilities as a coach
- demonstrate that you understand key elements relating to the protection of children and vulnerable adults, are able to deal with injuries should they occur and coach in an equitable manner
- understand the factors that affect performance (physical and psychological) and how to plan sessions to develop these.

Candidates should:

- be 18 years old at the start of the course
- hold a UKCC Level 1 or equivalent: BADMINTON England Level 1, BADMINTONscotland Instructors Award or the Welsh Badminton Union Leaders Award
- be able to demonstrate the competences required to achieve the UKCC Level 1 qualification.

Pre-Season Level Two

This level of coaching qualification provides a prospective coach with a general overview of all aspects of basketball and sports coaching and enables the holder to work independently to plan, deliver and review basketball coaching sessions without supervision.

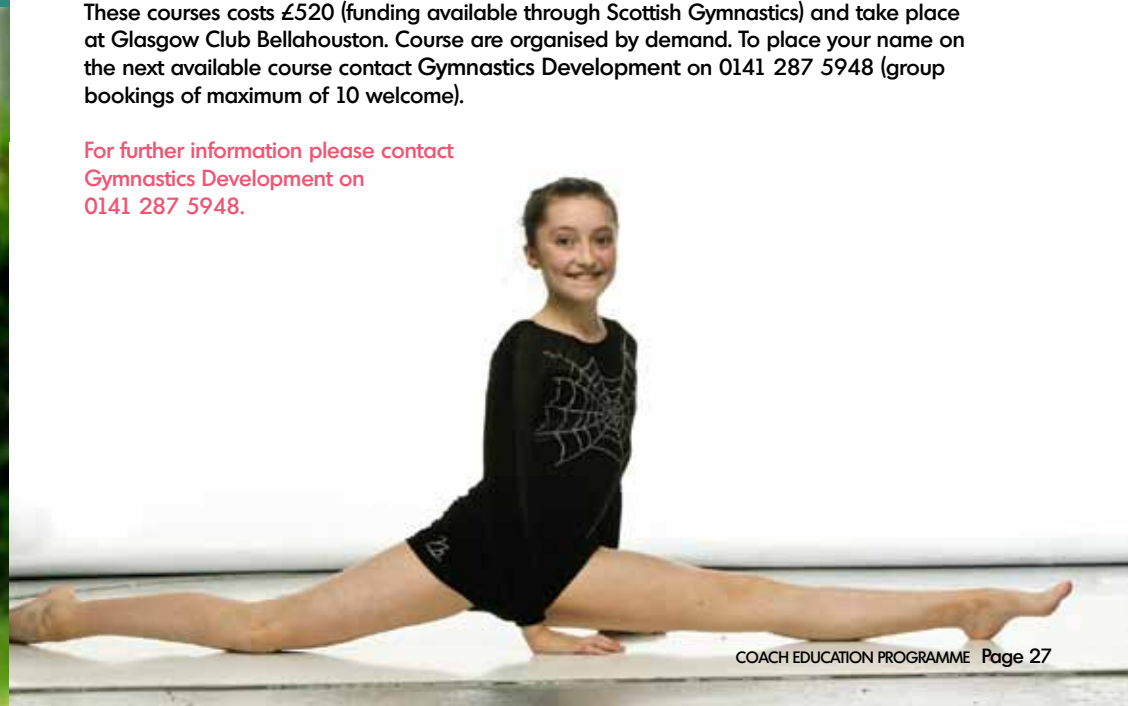

Volunteer Health Walk Leader Training Course

This one day course is designed to give people the skills, knowledge and confidence to lead health walks.
